About the Program

The aim of this program is to train young scientists to design and conduct research on significant problems in cancer by combining information and approaches from different scientific disciplines.

Trainees are jointly mentored by two mentors who provide distinct, complementary areas of expertise. Research projects must be broadly related to cancer.

December 1 - November 30

Positions

Training Grant Positions

A Kirschstein-NRSA institutional research training grant awarded to UW by the National Cancer Institute, jointly administered by UW and Fred Hutch

- Trainee must be eligible for Kirschstein-NRSA support
- Trainees can be based at UW or Fred Hutch

Fred Hutch-funded Positions

Institutional funds that increase total number of trainees and support those not eligible for training grant support

- No citizenship requirements
- Trainees and primary mentors must be based at Fred Hutch
