## **General Duties/Description:**

Job duties include, but are not limited to, teaching Japanese language classes in Japanese (usually in the morning), preparing/grading tests, homework, and assignments, keeping student records, participating in TA meetings, attending course lectures, and collaborating with the supervisor and other TAs.

## **Requirements:**

**Graduate students** enrolled in the University of Washington are eligible to apply. Previous teaching experience is a plus. Strong Japanese language skills are required. TA positions require strong organizational and communication skills and the ability to work well both individually and as part of team.

By the time of appointment, non-native English-speaking applicants must satisfy the English speaking proficiency requirements found in <u>Graduate School Memo 15</u>.

#### **Compensation:**

Salary is commensurate with academic standing, qualifications, and experience. The position includes a full tuition waiver, salary, and benefits including health insurance.

- 5. any records of past teaching experience (optional);

The **Home Department Statement of Support** and **Letter of Recommendation** are not required at this time.

Offers will be made by November 14 with a response deadline two weeks after the offers are made.
